


## **NEWSLETTER**

# Spring Meeting – 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2024

The meeting is to be held at the Village Hall, Kempley, Dymock GL18 2BP (See map)



There is car parking a short distance from the Village Hall. There will be a short walk (2.5 miles) in the morning leaving at 10.00 a.m. This will visit St Mary's Church with its medieval frescos and a churchvard full of daffodils and on the return to the village the opportunity to see St Edward's Church, an Arts & Crafts building with connections to our poets. There will be stops for

some poems and a bit of history and time to look around both churches. Walking boots are needed as the walk is across fields and some muddy areas.

The Hall will be available for attendees to eat their lunch from 12.00 midday. Tea/coffee available.

There will be two talks in the afternoon:

### 2.00 p.m. Rupert Brooke and the First World War

**Alisa Miller** holds a DPhil from the University of Oxford, an MA from the London School of Economics and a BA from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. Her research focuses on the comparative development of war cultures in twentieth century Europe and the United States.

### 3.00 p.m. Edward Marsh

**Sharon Mather** was a Fellow from 2006 until 2014 at Churchill College, Cambridge, before achieving a Distinction in M.A. Biography with the University of Buckingham in 2020 and awarded the University Prize for the Best Performance in Biography. She was shortlisted for the Tony Lothian Prize for *Edward Marsh: A Life of Poets, Painters & Players* published in October 2023.

### 4.00 p.m. Robert Frost readings

March 26th is Robert Frost's 150th birthday. We will be having readings of a selection of his poems in his honour.
